WHEREAS, Indian-Americans bring with them a rich culture including tasty food, vibrant music, and colorful dances that contribute to variety of restaurants and performances in Madison, Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, Indian-Americans continue to grow businesses, innovate, and strengthen our economy and create jobs in Madison, Wisconsin

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that I, Paul R. Soglin, the Mayor of the City of Madison, Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim the first Saturday in May as Indian-American Celebration Day in the City of Madison and commends Indian-Americans for the contributions they have made to the City of Madison; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this proclamation is presented to the Indian-American community in recognition of their contribution to the diversity of the City of Madison.
