Two key federal programs help libraries make positive impacts in your community:

Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA)

The Library Services and Technology Act is the only source of dedicated federal funding for libraries. The Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) administers LSTA. Every state receives LSTA funding to address local priorities, such as:

- support jobseekers with free career training and certifications
- provide resources for small businesses and entrepreneurs
- promote reading skills and early literacy; and
- deliver internet access and digital skills classes.
